

# Our History

Friends of Wakulla Springs State Park, Inc. was organized in 1995 to provide a way to generate more community support, education and advocacy for the Park and Springs. Our immediate challenge was preventing the construction of a service station on the environmentally sensitive area near the entrance to the Park. The State eventually purchased this important property with our support.

Following are a list of recent activities funded/supported by the Friends of Wakulla Springs State Park:

- Added an Online store to the Friends of Wakulla Springs State Park webpage and have started selling a handful of item offerings.
- Created a music album (CD) of original songs about the Park, generously donated by Park Ranger Collin Johnson and other talented Park staff, which is being sold through the Online store as well as in partnership with the Lodge Concession Gift Shop.
- Developed a standard "traveling" program about the Friends, which will be showcased (e.g., at local festivals in the area, among other events), in an effort to continue growing our membership base.
- Obtained \$500K from the Dpt of State Div. of Historic Resources for a Historic Preservation grant to restore the Lodge (e.g., elevator, historic windows, etc.) with additional cost share support provided by FDEP.
- Implementation of a Capital Campaign to help support: an Interpretive Center, waterfront renovations, including the boat maintenance program & sustainability, dock repair and maintenance, dive tower repair, among other critical need areas.
- Continuing to partner with FDEP for ongoing project replacement and restoration of the entire boat fleet; expected to take 1-2 years.
- Ongoing Florida Humanities Council grant for at least three speakers (for both virtual & live audiences) renowned experts in their fields, for the annual "Florida Talks" Program.
- Continuing to work on and support the next phase of the CRTPA "Bike Trail" connection project.
- Ongoing hosting of educational oriented workshops; e.g., "Climate Up Close", Cave Exploration, Fly Tying, among others.
- In addition, efforts will continue to establish new trails, provide educational materials to schools and programming at the Park, and further understanding of water quality issues impacting Wakulla Springs, among other areas.
